



## MACINTOSH INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR **MacWireless 11g PC Card**


*Note: This product requires Mac OS X 10.2.6 or higher (10.2.8 or higher recommended). No software installation is necessary as all the necessary drivers are included in the OS. We recommend updating your operating system to the latest version before proceeding with the configuration process. Free updates are available at [www.apple.com](http://www.apple.com).*

### Installation

1. If you have an internal AirPort card, remove it. (Note: there can only be one AirPort-driven device in your machine.)
2. Insert PC card & turn computer on.
3. Go to System Preferences > Network > Location
4. Make a new location called "AirPort".
5. Go to System Preferences > Network > Show: Network Port Configurations.
6. Enable AirPort by checking its box and clicking "Apply Now".
7. Disable all other options, and drag AirPort to the top of the list.
8. Go to System Preferences > Network > Show: AirPort > AirPort Tab.
9. Check the "Show AirPort status in menu bar" check box.
10. Go to your Applications folder and open Internet Connect.
11. Click the "Turn AirPort On" button to enable AirPort.
12. Using the "Network" drop-down menu, choose the Network that you would like to join.
13. Go back to System Preferences > Network > Show: AirPort > AirPort Tab.
14. Choose "By Default, join: A Specific Network", enter your Network ID and password, and click "Apply Now", or choose "By Default, join: Automatic". Click "Apply Now"
15. Click on the TCP/IP Tab.
16. Make sure all these settings are correct for your network, make any necessary modifications, and click "Apply Now". (The most commonly used setting is "Configure IPv4: Using DHCP". If you are unsure, contact your ISP or Network Administrator to find out what your settings should be).



### Inserting and Removing Card

Before removing the MacWireless 11g card, first turn off AirPort from the AirPort menu, and then choose "Power Off Card" ("Eject" on some PowerBook models) from the PC Card menu .

For more help with your wireless network or how to configure your AirPort wireless connection, go to the Mac Help menu and double click on AirPort Help.

### Known Issues

**Issue:** The PC Card menu displays '802.11b CardBus' rather than '802.11g CardBus'.

**Solution:** This is a display bug in the Apple software. The cards are in fact 802.11g, 54 Mbps cards and this has been confirmed with speed tests. For peace of mind in regards to this matter, you can set your base station to '802.11g only' mode, and the cards will still connect. The display bug is unlikely to get fixed, as it is Apple's software that produces it.
